

SIMMONS FIRST*
EQUAL OPPORTUNITY POLICY STATEMENT FOR
QUALIFIED PERSONS WITH A DISABILITY AND QUALIFIED PROTECTED VETERANS

Under the Affirmative Action obligations imposed by Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Vietnam Era Veterans' Readjustment Assistance Act of 1974 (VEVRAA), as amended, it is the policy of Simmons First* to provide Equal Employment Opportunities and to advance in employment qualified individuals with a disability as well as qualified protected veterans. This policy is designed to employ and advance all qualified individuals with a disability and qualified protected veterans at all levels of employment, including the executive level. Simmons First*'s policy of providing Equal Employment Opportunities to qualified persons with a disability and qualified protected veterans shall apply to all employment practices including, but not limited to: upgrading, demotion or transfer, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training. Simmons First* attempts to comply with all of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor and the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs (OFCCP), issued pursuant to Section 503 of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act and the 1974 Vietnam Era Veterans' Readjustment Assistance Act, as amended.

Simmons First*'s Affirmative Action Program for qualified persons with a disability and qualified protected veterans is reviewed and updated annually. If there are any significant changes in Simmons First*'s procedure, or if employee rights or benefits are modified as a result of an annual updating, these changes are communicated to employees and to applicants for employment.

On a strictly voluntary basis, Simmons First* invites all qualified protected veterans who are either employees or applicants for employment, and employees who have a disability, and who wish to benefit under Simmons First*'s Affirmative Action Program to identify themselves to either their immediate supervisor or to the EEO Coordinator. Any individual who identifies himself/herself will not be subjected to any form of harassment or retaliation based on his/her status or self-identification. Further, this self-identification will be kept confidential.

Employees and applicants shall not be subjected to harassment, intimidation, threats, coercion or discrimination because they have engaged in or may engage in any of the following activities: (1) filing a complaint; (2) assisting or participating in an investigation, compliance review, hearing, or any other activity related to the administration of Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, VEVRAA, as amended, or any other Federal, state or local law requiring equal opportunity for disabled persons or qualified protected veterans or; (3) opposing any act or practice made unlawful by Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, VEVRAA or its implementing regulations in this part or any other federal, state or local law requiring equal opportunity for disabled persons or for qualified protected veterans; or (4) exercising any other right protected by Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, or its implementing regulations in this part or any other right protected by VEVRAA or its implementing regulations in this part.
